Road Reconstruction and Bike Lane upgrade on Shuter Street from River Street to Bond Street

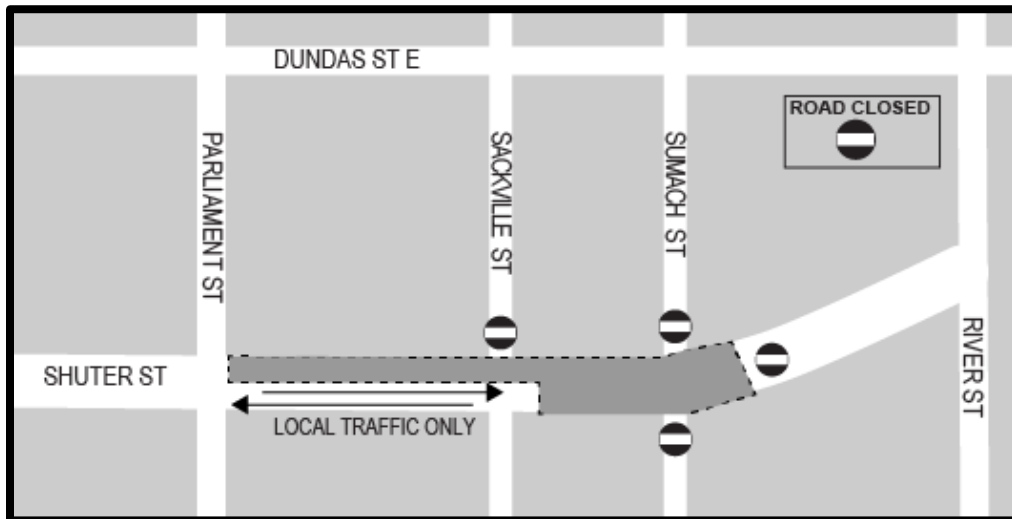
This notice provides an update on the road reconstruction and upgrades the bike lanes to separated cycle tracks on Shuter Street from River Street to Bond Street.

On August 24, the intersection of Sumach Street and Shuter Street was closed to allow for the full reconstruction of the intersection. This closure is expected to last until September 21. This closure is necessary to ensure construction work in front of Nelson Mandela Park Public School is completed before school starts in Mid-September.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT COVID-19 AND CONSTRUCTION WORK IN TORONTO

As restrictions on construction have been lifted by the Province of Ontario, City-led infrastructure will continue to proceed. During construction, the contractor is responsible for the Health & Safety on site under the Ontario Occupational Health and Safety Act and is expected to implement COVID-19 mitigation practices. Phase and Dates	Work location	Crews will:
Phase 1 June 29 to September 25	Sherbourne Street to River Street	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Dig up road surface and replace base concrete and repaving the road surface • Repair curbs, gutters and driveways • Replace sidewalk in some areas • Adjust corner radii at some intersections and install tactile plates

Phase 2 August 24 to September 21	Sumach Street and Shuter Street Intersection	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Replace sidewalk in front of Nelson Mandela Park Public School • Dig up road surface and replace base concrete and repaving the road surface • Repair curbs, gutters and driveways • Electrical work for Pedestrian Crossover
Phase 3 September 15 to October 24	Bike lane upgrade from Sherbourne Street to Bond Street	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Adjust bike lane markings and parking • Install concrete curbstones and bollards (posts)

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- The community will experience dust, noise and traffic delays.
- The City will make efforts to reduce impacts. Your patience is appreciated.

	Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.
	Traffic Management: Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets. Traffic on Shuter Street will be reduced to one shared lane in each direction through the work zone. Full closure of Sumach Street and Shuter Street from August 24 to September 21. See Map of Intersection Closure for full details.
	Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times. Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.
	Parking: Parking in the active work zone is not permitted as space is needed for construction equipment and materials. This project will affect on-street parking. If your parked vehicle affects construction work, it will be relocated with no charge to the owner. Please call 416-808-2222 for its location.
	Parking Violation Notice: In an effort to reduce ticketing due to construction, the City encourages communities with construction to be patient as neighbours may need to temporarily relocate vehicles. If enforcement is called, enforcement must issue a yellow parking violation notice (ticket). If you receive a yellow notice during this construction work, do the following within 15 days of the notice date: 1) Contact the site inspector or person listed on the Construction Notice and give them the yellow notice number. 2) Dispute the parking violation notice online or in person following the process listed on the reverse side of the parking violation notice. You may use this construction notice as part of the explanation of why the violation should be cancelled. Please note: violation notices cannot be cancelled if vehicles are parked in illegal parking spots (i.e. in front of a fire hydrant or in no parking zones).

	<p>Accessible Accommodation: Residents who require accommodation (level entry, longer notice, etc.) must contact the Public Consultation Unit to arrange for access during the construction period.</p>
