Dos and don'ts



Toronto Community Housing (TCHC) is reminding tenants about Toronto's municipal election on **Monday, October 24**. TCHC encourages tenants and staff to participate in the election. Please follow the election guidelines for campaigning in our communities.

What to do



Do vote.

You can vote on **October 24** or in advance. You should receive a Voter Information Card in the mail. Please consult toronto.ca/elections for information on advance voting and the location of your voting station. You can also vote by mail in advance.



Do allow candidates to canvass in your building.

It's any candidate's right to be able to access potential constituents for the purpose of canvassing. This includes knocking on doors, talking to tenants and leaving flyers behind with those tenants.



Do put up election signs inside your home.

Examples include in your window or on your wall.

What not to do



Don't put up election signs on your balcony, on the outside of your unit door or in common areas of your building.

This is both dangerous and against the law.



Don't share any personal information you're not comfortable sharing.

This includes with candidates who come to your door, or with anyone else. TCHC will **not** share tenant lists with candidates or political parties. We respect tenant privacy.
