



# IN-PERSON ROOKIE LEAGUE 2021

## How are we making in-person Rookie League safe?

Toronto Community Housing and Jays Care are committed to delivering a safe and fun in-person Rookie League day camp in 2021. We've developed new health and safety protocols and procedures to minimize the risks associated with COVID-19 and we are excited to welcome participants and staff back to camp this summer.

The following are highlights of the health and safety measures we're putting in place to provide an amazing camp experience while keeping safety and wellbeing at the forefront.

## Campers and Staff

- All camp participants and staff will wear a mask while at camp\*. There will be mask breaks throughout the day for campers and staff to remove their masks safely while following physical distancing measures.
- Campers and staff will remain with the same cohort of people throughout the duration of their camp session.
- Staff to camper ratio will be 1:7; cohorts will have a maximum of 20 campers and 3 staff.
- Where possible, campers who live in the same household will be placed in the same cohort.
- We are committed to working with Toronto Public Health if suspected or confirmed COVID-19 cases arise.
- All staff participate in COVID-19 Protocol and Safety training to ensure camps are consistently providing a safer environment for campers and staff to have fun this summer.
- You can expect regular and open communication between camp and home.

## Camp Activities and Environment

- All camp participants and staff will start their camp day at our Welcome Health Screening Station located at the entrance to camp. Both campers and staff are required to complete and pass a home and camp health screening process to gain entry to camp.
- Camp activities will take place primarily outdoors; however, when activities are held indoors, signage, space layout and activities will follow our COVID-19 protocols to maintain safe health practices.
- Additional camp supplies and equipment will be provided to reduce shared equipment between cohorts.
- There will be a dedicated Contact Tracer Lead at each camp site responsible for daily health screenings and working with Toronto Public Health.
- Dedicated cleaning staff will be on site to maintain standards for cleaning the site. Cleaning of high touch areas will be conducted twice a day, rooms that are used by multiple cohorts will be cleaned before and after.
- Camp programming will incorporate more opportunities for campers and staff to wash their hands with soap and water throughout the day.
- There will be a designated eating area that allows for physical distancing for campers to enjoy their bagged lunch provided by camp.
- There will be tons of fun camp activities provided throughout the summer; however, there won't be field trips or swimming provided at camp this year.
- There will be signage around camp to support with physical distancing, effective hand washing, and the flow of foot traffic to promote safe distancing among cohorts.
