How to vote



Before voting day

- 1. Learn more about the local engagement options.
- 2. Watch the tenant engagement video. Tenants are required to watch it before voting. You can watch it online at **torontohousing.ca/TER** or at the polling station.

On voting day

- 1. Register with staff and show photo ID and proof of address (i.e., driver's licence, letter, student card, health card).
- 2. Watch the video at the polling station if you have not already watched it on our website.
- 3. Mark your ballot behind the voting screen, fold the ballot and place it in the ballot box.
- 4. Return to the polling station once voting has closed for a public ballot count and announcement of the preferred local engagement option for your community.

Get ready to cast your vote for the option that best fits for your community.

Which option will you choose?

Participating in the Tenant Engagement System Refresh will allow your community to get involved in local decision-making. Tenants will be able to address local priorities, be represented, and have their voice heard in the community. Tenants will vote on the engagement option that best fits their community. There are four options:

Community Representatives

Part of the Tenant Engagement System



Tenants elect two representatives for every 250 households.

Elected members:

- work with Toronto Community Housing and partners to address community priorities
- implement and monitor the Community's Action Plan
- represent their community at the Tenant Community Action Table

Building/Townhouse Committee

Part of the Tenant Engagement System

Open to all tenants.

Each committee:

- works with Toronto Community Housing and partners to address community priorities
- implements and monitors the Community's Action Plan
- selects two members to represent their community at the Tenant **Community Action Table**

Tenant Association Independent



Independent from Toronto Community Housing.

Each association:

- is an independent membership group
- can choose to form a tenant association in addition to being engaged in the refreshed Tenant **Engagement System**
- has no community representation at the Tenant Community Action Table

No Representation Independent



Tenants will have no community representation in the refreshed Tenant Engagement System.

No representation means:

- no representation in local decision-making
- a community is unable to implement and monitor their Community's Action Plan
- no community representation at the Tenant Community Action Table
