APPLICATION PACKAGE 2023

The Allenbury Gardens Scholarship program recognizes the commitment of Allenbury Gardens tenants to bettering the world around them and cultivating change in their field of interest. This scholarship is intended for Allenbury Gardens tenants of any age with the goal of obtaining any of the following achievements to build up or grow in their career:

- A post-secondary degree from a Canadian college or university
- A training or academic certificate from an accredited Canadian educational institute or training school
- Completion of a single course from an accredited Canadian educational institute or training school

What does the program offer?

- ❖ The program offers scholarship awards valued **up to \$3,000** to cover tuition fees for **any program** at a post-secondary institute, educational or training school, including colleges, universities, career academies, or any accredited Canadian educational/training institutes. These programs can be full-time studies, part-time studies, or single course enrollment, either inperson, online, or hybrid.
- ❖ Additionally, a bursary of **\$500** is available to cover expenses such as textbooks, childcare, transportation, and other related costs.

How will the scholarship be paid?

Funds will be released directly to the educational/training institution **upon proof of enrollment**, and **prior to the end of the first month of enrollment**, i.e., prior to October 2023 for applicants who applied for the Fall term and prior to February 2024 for applicants who applied to the Spring 2024 term.

Who is eligible?

Tenants of Allenbury Gardens who can answer <u>ves</u> to all of the following:

- ✓ I am a relocated **Toronto Community Housing Corporation (TCHC) tenant** of Allenbury Gardens (former #5, #9, #15 Kingslake rd. #9, #15, #17, #19 Allenbury Gardens, #128, #150, #170, #180 Fairview Mall Dr.) with proof of good standing tenancy.
- ✓ I am entering or am currently enrolled in a post-secondary institution (college, university) or taking training courses from an accredited Canadian educational or training institutions (career academy, trade school, etc.).
- ✓ I am able to demonstrate community involvement and/or leadership.
- ✓ I am able to demonstrate a need for financial assistance.

What is community involvement and/or leadership?

Community involvement is meaningful, consistent participation in activities that support and improve people's well-being. A community may be geographic (building or neighbourhood) or based on shared experiences and interests (e.g. a faith, social of school group you are involved with). When you take initiative, support and work with others in your community you are involved in your community and taking a leadership role.

Some examples:

Since the start of high school, **A** has run art workshops for children and their parents each summer at the local community centre.

B recently immigrated to Canada. He has not had an opportunity to volunteer here but back home was active with a local charity that advocates for food security.

C is a mother of three, cares about healthy nutrition and wants to share her experience with other mothers. Each month she runs a live event to share affordable recipes and tips, as well as a club at the local library where neighbors get together to talk about healthy food and self-care.

D likes singing and performing at local events. Through her songs, D gives the message of hope, and encourages care and love for self, others and the Earth.

How are recipients chosen?

Allenbury Gardens Scholarship Program places a high value on individuals who are committed to their learning goals and accomplishments, have demonstrated leadership in their communities, and are committed to the betterment of society.

Recipients will be chosen by a Scholarship Review Committee and will be evaluated based on:

- Community involvement (see examples on page 3) and/or leadership
- Learning goals
- Academic accomplishments (if applicable)
- Financial need
- Workplace and volunteer experience (résumé)
- Education plan

What should be submitted?

To apply for the scholarship, please complete the attached application package from **pages 6 to 17**. The package includes:

- Application form
- Reference(s)
- Résumé
- Most recent report card or academic transcript (if applicable)
- Career and education plan
- Personal statement
- Budget and financial statement
- Application checklist
- Certification

How to fill out and sign your application:

- Once your application is completed, sign the form by adding your initials in the designated place. Your initials can be in the form of "[First Letter of your First Name]". [First Letter of Your last name]".
- Supporting documents including Resume, reference letter(s), report card/academic transcript (or equivalent), and optional documents can be saved and sent as separate documents.
- You can either insert your Personal and Financial Statements in the designated boxes in the application form or send them as separate documents.


